## The studying experience in Kyoto University

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For 9 days studying at Kyoto University, I could get an academic experience that I hadn't known before. First of all, I studied in the classroom for 5 days and each day I studied in different topics such as the history and culture of Kyoto, Southeast Asia or ASEAN, Japanese business and industrial policy.
