Programme for Special Exchange Students (Winter Term 2014/2015)

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(a) Before I came to study in this program, I only got a topic idea in big issues, such as country or global levels. For example middle-income trap in Thailand, government expenditure in country transportation. But I know that deep inside, my real interested lies in human behavior, in particular about the question: 'what is the reason that people decide to choose any option, whether the chosen decision is carefully examined by using lessons from human history or using only human instinct'. However I fail to connect my interests with economics and failed to create a new topic without using the same idea from the other papers or journals.

In this program I learned a lot about sustainable development. At first, I felt that this kind of topic was very wide and many things must be considered.
