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I am very lucky to be selected as the only exchange student from our school, Renmin University, to come to Japan, to experience Japanese life and study as long as half an year, thanks to this program. This program is an exchange program between the Graduate School of Economics, Kyoto University, and School of Economics, Renmin University with Jasso Scholarship. Life here is not as hard as imagine because people are really friendly and be ready to help. With both English, Japanese, even body language, I finally survived here and got used to.

For other free time in Kyoto, I often came out with friends here and traveled around. I went to Nara, Osaka, Hakone, Tokyo and so on. I love the blue sky, clean streets and polite people here. Kyoto is quite traditional and precious treasure of the world. I also participated a sing competition held by the Chinese Student Organization and made friends with several Chinese students who also studied in Kyoto. What is unforgettable is the experience of New year here. It is a little bit different from Chinese New Year, people here celebrate new year with special food and visit shrines. I also visited a shrine and knocked the clock on the night of the last day of 2015. It was quite unique and interesting.
