Hankyu Railway Rakusaiguchi Station : Yasaka Bus #1 or #6(20 min.)

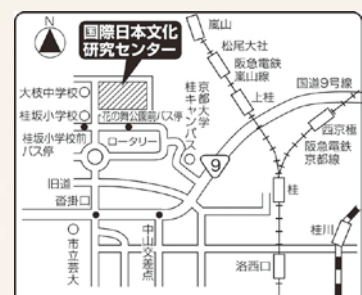
Hankyu Railway Katsura Station (West Exit) :
