The 18th Next-Generation Global Workshop: Visual Media in a Post-Growth Era

The Next-Generation Global Workshop (NGGW) has been organized annually since 2008 by Kyoto University in collaboration with European and Asian partner universities to give early career researchers the opportunity to present their research in English and receive feedback from an international audience. The workshop has proven to be an effective capacity-building opportunity as it is mentored by professors from participating universities around the world. It also provides an invaluable opportunity for participants to learn from each other and deepen their understanding of various social phenomena in the world, particularly in Asia. Ultimately, the NGGW has created a forum for scholars of different generations and regions to establish a common academic ground.

This year the workshop focuses on the potential of visual media in a post-growth era, in which growing concern has shown on the sustainability issue regarding population, environment and social connectedness. In addition to a keynote speech and a film screening attraction, the workshop will focus on presentations by around twenty advanced MA and PhD students. The workshop will accept applications with a wide range of topics, so as to offer more opportunities for attendance.

We, therefore, invite original research papers, case studies, ethnographic writings and policy analyses addressing diverse dimensions from media studies and all other fields of the humanities and social sciences. Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- 2. Conviviality and the role of the media
- 3. Media and environmental issues
- 4. Rethinking the myth of growth
- 5. Re-examination of "Generation Z"
- 6. Images embodying "alternatives"
- 7. Simplified (kansona) media

- 9. Transnational migration and usage of digital media
- 10. Reevaluating media for the affluence of social relationship
- 11. Intersectionality and the politics of visual media
- 12. Media histories and its evolution
- 13. How to restore commoning/commons
- 14. Thinking about "sharing"
- 15. De-premising growth for humanity and social science
- 16. Entrepreneurship and social contribution for young people
- 17. Population, environment and/or energy sustainability in a post-growth era
- 18. Restructuring care network for social resilience

Master's students and Ph.D. students. The Organizing Committee will screen the applications based on candidates' qualifications and abstracts.

Submission Guidelines

- Applicants are requested to submit an abstract of their paper by the 1st of June (JST) via application form.
- Abstracts must be concise, about 500 words, and include the title, author(s), affiliation, and contact information. (See the application form)
- Each submission will undergo a blind selection process. Result of the selection will be notified by the middle of June

Travel Support

The organizer plans to provide travel grants for a limited number of participants. Please state your intention whether to attend the screening for the travel grant by the application form. The selection of the travel grant receiver will be based on your abstract submitted.

Revised Paper submission and Publication

After the workshop taken place, participant may modify the paper according to the advices received from the advisors and submit the revised version. The revised papers submitted will be

published on the Kyoto University Research Information Repository (KURENAI). Outstanding papers may also have a chance to publish on other Journals.
